# **Request for Proposal**

The City of Sacramento is seeking Proposals for a Community Partner to lead Community Engagement for the Meadowview Neighborhood Active Transportation Assessment Project

## Introduction

The City of Sacramento is searching for a local community partner to lead a forwardthinking community-driven engagement plan to work with several neighborhoods in



South Sacramento on assessing barriers to active transportation and identifying actionable strategies to improve health equity and multi-modal access to community destinations.

This plan will:

- Summarize community engagement and listening
- Identify the barriers to walking, rolling, and transit access. Barriers may include but are not limited to:
  - o High Speed Traffic
  - o Lack of Sidewalks or gaps;
  - o Lack of curb ramp;
  - o Obstructed sidewalk;
  - o Nonexistent Bikeways or gaps;
  - o Crossing challenges; and
  - o Lack of tree canopy.
- Recommend a list of community-supported infrastructure improvements and programs that the city may use to go after funding for implementation.

This planned project timeline is March 1, 2025 through December 31, 2027.

## About the Community


The project area focuses on the South City Farms, Golf Course Terrace Estates, Meadowview, and Valley Hi neighborhoods in South Sacramento. These neighborhoods have a high racial diversity, with approximately 21.5% of people identifying as Asian, 21% as Black or African American, 35% as Hispanic/Latino, 0.5% as Native American or Alaskan Native, 3% as Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, 13% as White, and 6% as some other race. Approximately 14.5% of households do not speak English as a primary language at home, with common languages being Spanish and Hmong.

The community is primarily suburban, with some commercial businesses along arterial corridors such as Florin Road and Mack Road. Schools in the neighborhoods are within the Sacramento City Unified School District in the northern areas and Elk Grove Unified School District in the southern areas.

Key community assets and destinations include the Pannell Meadowview Community Center, Mack Road Valley Hi Community Center, Martin Luther King Jr. Library, Valley Hi-North Laguna Library, Cosumnes River College, Sacramento Regional Transit light rail
